

Canadian MPN Research Foundation Announces Launch of MPN Genie® App FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

The Canadian MPN Research Foundation has announced the upcoming release of the MPN Genie® App for patients, health care providers and researchers in the MPN community.

The app is a quality-of-life tracking tool that enables patients with myeloproliferative neoplasms (or MPNs, a rare, incurable blood cancer that begins with an abnormal mutation in a stem cell in the bone marrow. The change leads to a change in bone marrow production) to track symptoms and quality of life indicators on a regular basis, and share this data directly with their health care providers, enabling more effective quality of life and symptom management over time, as well as higher-value face to face interactions between patients and their doctors. Additionally, aggregated, anonymized data collected from the app will empower MPN researchers to support their ongoing work.

“Quality of life often represents the main opportunity MPN patients have to exercise control over their disease,” says Cheryl Petruk, Executive Director of the Canadian MPN Research Foundation. “The MPN Genie App® will support them in doing that.”

The app was first announced at the Canadian MPN Research Foundation’s Annual Roundtable on November 19, 2021 and will officially launch for both iOS and Android on March 25, 2022.
